#86 - Stay close to your baby for three years -

With Abenomics (the economic and monetary policies of Japanese Prime Minister Abe) creating a number of controversies, Prime Minister Abe made another remark to add to the list. In the section titled “A Japan in Which Women Shine” during his speech on “Growth Strategy,” he talked about the improvement of women’s positions, the accelerating process to eliminate childcare waiting lists, the improvement of maternity leaves, and the return to work environment.
